Thank you for providing Highways England with the opportunity to comment on the submission version of the Yetminster and Ryme Intrinseca Neighbourhood Plan. Highways England is responsible or operating, maintaining and improving the strategic road network which in this case comprises the A303 and A35 trunk roads which pass some distance to the north and south respectively of the plan area. It is noted that the A37, which passes to the west of the parish, provides a connection to both trunk roads.

However, we are satisfied that the plan's proposed policies are unlikely to lead to development that will adversely impact on the safe and efficient operation of the strategic road network and we therefore have no comments to make. However, this does not prejudice any future responses we may make on site specific applications as they come forward through the planning process, which will continue to be considered by Highways England on their merits in line with prevailing policy.
