Joanne,

Thank you for your email.

In this instance, the examiner has misinterpreted ONR's Land Use Planning's response: we have not made a determination. To clarify, our response only provided guidance on our land use planning policy and explained the requirements any development in-scope of our policy must meet in order for ONR to not advise against it at the planning application stage. ONR is only able to formally respond with "do not advise against" or "advise against" when it is consulted on a **planning application** for a specific, in-scope development.

From the e-mail chain below, I understand that your colleagues have considered our requirements and have satisfied themselves that they are met. If this is insufficient and the examiner requires ONR's view, then we would be willing to indicate what our view would be on planning applications made for in-scope developments in the neighbourhood plan, but we would need you to identify any in-scope developments and submit the details of these separately. I can advise on how to do this, if this is your preference. However, it is perhaps useful for screening purposes to consider that ONR's extant Winfrith "outer consultation zone" is a circle of 3 km radius centred on British National Grid reference <u>SY818868</u>: if there are no developments in the neighbourhood plan located partially or entirely in the outer consultation zone, then there are no in-scope developments and ONR would not comment on any planning application made.

It is worth noting that ONR will imminently be writing to Local Authorities to inform them of planned updates to our Land Use Planning policy. These updates will include the introduction of an additional 12 km consultation zone (again centred on British National Grid reference SY818868 for Winfrith) for major hazard facilities only. Major hazard facilities are military installations storing munitions and also facilities included within the scope of the Control of Major Accident Hazard Regulations 2015, the Offshore Installations Regulations 2015, the Offshore Installations (Safety Case) Regulations 2005, or the Pipelines Safety Regulations 1996 that could pose an external hazard to the site. If there are no such facilities proposed in your neighbourhood plan, then this will not affect you when the updated policy comes into effect.

Post our recent conversation, I have been able to speak with my Land Use Planning (LUP) colleagues (Eamonn Guilfoyle) to seek their advice. I have attached Eamonn's email, but have copied the main body of text below.

I hope the response below (& attached) provides the necessary advice & support you require – if I (and/or Eamonn) can support further, please do not hesitate to call / email. I have copied in Eamonn and the LUP email account for any further LUP related queries you may have.

ONR requests consultation from local planning authorities on local development and neighbourhood plans that include developments located within our consultation zones that meet our consultation criteria. This enables ONR to ensure that the local authority understands what ONR requires of any such development in order for ONR to not advise against it at the planning application stage. Our consultation zones and consultation criteria are described on our land use planning policy (<u>http://www.onr.org.uk/land-use-planning.htm</u>).

If a development is located in one of our consultation zones and meets our consultation criteria, then ONR will not advise against the development if, in the inspector's opinion, the following requirements are met:

• the relevant local authority emergency planners have provided adequate assurance that the proposed development can be accommodated within their existing off-site emergency planning arrangements (or an amended version) made under the Radiation (Emergency Preparedness and Public Information) Regulations 2019; and

• the development does not represent an external hazard to a nuclear site or the planning function for the site that may be affected by the development has demonstrated that it would not constitute a significant hazard with regard to safety on their site.

You report that Dorset County Council has engaged with AEE Winfrith on the council's Wareham Neighbourhood plan. The local authority should consider whether this is necessary in this case:

• If these exists any off-site emergency plan made under REPPIR19, then the local authority's emergency planners will be the owners of it and should be in a position to determine whether any development can be accommodated within the plan; and

• The types of developments with the potential to pose an external hazard to a nuclear site are described in the third row of the table found in Part 2 of our land use planning policy (<u>http://www.onr.org.uk/land-use-planning.htm</u>), and if no type of development capable of posing an external hazard to site are proposed within ONR's consultation zone, then the external hazard requirement will be met automatically.
