Re: North Dorset Local Plan Review – Issues and Options Consultation

We write to formally respond to Q29 as set out in the above consultation's Response Form and comment as follows:

Q29 asks "Do you consider that the land which is identified and safeguarded for the Shaftesbury Outer Bypass and the Charlton Marshall and Spetisbury Bypass should continue to be identified and safeguarded for such purposes?"

The A350 Community Group (representing 9 Parishes between Shaftesbury and Blandford Forum) holds the unanimous view that the answer is an unqualified YES, the land should continue to be identified and safeguarded for such purposes.

Why? Because there are two current developments that might provide the long overdue and much needed improvements to North Dorset's road infrastructure.
