	Whilst any other areas around Shaftesbury remain suitable and potentially available for development of any kind, it would seem to be absolute folly to permanently remove the existing protection of the proposed route for the Shaftesbury Outer Eastern Bypass (for which there is no viable alternative). When, as seems not just probable but almost inevitable at some future date, the A350 is upgraded to meet the strategic need for improved north-south connectivity to South Coast ports, to allow major increases in road traffic, including HGVs, one can only imagine with a degree of horror the impact on Shaftesbury and its residents if there is no bypass.
