Development should be concentrated in the three major towns, Gillingham, Dhaftebury and Blandford.

Vital infrastructure works required to facilitate the development include:

Upgraded road links between the three towns and between both Gillingham and Shaftesbury to the A303

An upgraded road link between Blandford and Poole

Serious consideration of a rail (re)connection between Blandford and Poole for passengers and freight

Gillingham town-centre upgrade:

For too long, Gillingham has struggled, with expansion to the perimeter but with no corresponding development of the centre. The centre should be redeveloped sympathetically to create a local draw, not only for shopping but for restaurant, commercial and residential use with new flats in new shops in the area between the station and High Street. There is a huge opportunity to make something of the town so that it can service the residents to a far greater degree and use the rail and improved road links for greater commercial prosperity.

Regarding Stalbridge:

It is completely impractical to amend the plan to include Stalbridge as a local centre. It is a small settlement in open countryside, with limited facilities, poor transport links and is unsuited to major residential building. Any further development with be unsustainable and destroy the settlement and the countryside around it.
