A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 35**; **Figure 1**). There are no recorded designated assets on the Site, but part of one non-designated asset, a post-medieval gravel pit (**Figure 1** no. **9**). Two Scheduled areas relating to Bronze Age barrows are situated to the north of the Site (**Figure 1** nos. **1** & **2**). The research radius contains a Grade II Listed building (**Figure 1** no. **3**), Carey House which is located *c*. 300 to the west of the Site. The research area also contains a total of 12 non-designated assets, which include further prehistoric features (**Figure 1** nos. **4** & **5**), as well as a large number of post-medieval quarries and agricultural features.

Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs




Figure 2. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 37**; **Figure 2**). There are no recorded designated assets on the Site, but there is a single non-designated asset. This comprises part of an area of early 20th century military practice tranches (**Figure 2** no. **4**), and occur in most parts of the Site. Further non-designated early 20th century trenching, craters and the tank training area surround the Site (**Figure 2** nos. **1**, **5** & **7**). Non-designated modern period gravel pits occur within the research area on to the east and south-east of the Site (**Figure 2** nos. **2**, **3** & **8**) In addition, there is a post-medieval pound (**Figure 2** no. **6**) immediately to the north of the Site and historic or modern trackways (**Figure 2** nos. **9-10**) *c*. 400m to the north-east of the Site. There are no Scheduled Monuments or Listed buildings within the research area.

Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs




Figure 3. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (Table 37; Figure 3). There are no recorded designated or non-designated assets on the Site. A total of three Grade II Listed buildings are within the research radius (Figure 3 nos. 1-3). These comprise a 17th -18th century farmhouse and associated barn at Merritown (Figure 1 nos. 1 & 2) which is c. 220m to the west of the Site, and the late 17th-early 18th century Dales House (Figure 3 no. 3) which is immediately adjacent to the southern boundary of the Site. (Figure 3 no. 4). In addition, there are three other non-designated assets within the research area (Figure 3 nos. 5-6). A series of circular features at Hurn Court Farm have been noted from aerial photography, and evaluation and excavation in the area has revealed extensive Bronze Age, Iron Age, Romano-British and post-medieval features and deposits, including ring ditches and field systems.

Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs




Figure 4. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 39**; **Figure 4**). There are no recorded designated or non-designated assets on the Site. A total of four Scheduled Monuments are within the research radius (**Figure 4** nos. **1-4**). These comprise prehistoric field monuments, one of which, a Bronze Age barrow (**Figure 4** no. **1**) is immediately adjacent to the boundary of the northern area of the Site. Another lies within *c*. 100-150m of both parts of the Site (**Figure 4** no. **2**), with two barrows slightly more distant to the east of the eastern part of the Site. The example *c*. 500m to the east comprises a barrow cemetery with associated prehistoric cross ridge dyke (**Figure 4** no. **4**). In addition, there are three other non-designated assets within the research area (**Figure 4** nos. **5-7**). One of these is the medieval deer park (**Figure 4** no. **7**) situated to the north of the Site, with the remaining assets comprising the sites of post-medieval aggregate extraction.

Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 41**; **Figure 5**). There are no recorded designated assets on the Site, but the north-east edge of the Site impinges on the area of two non-designated post-medieval assets (**Figure 5** nos. **14-15**) relating to tracks and drainage. There is a Scheduled Bronze Age barrow (**Figure 5** no. **1**) immediately adjacent to the southern tip of the Site, but no Listed structures in the area. There are however a further 12 non-designated assets within the research area on all sides of the Site (**Figure 5** nos. **2-13**) comprising a further possible barrow, historic to modern tracks, post-medieval agricultural and quarry features and WWII rifle butts.

Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs




Figure 6. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 43**; **Figure 6**). There are no recorded designated assets on the Site, but there are two non-designated assets. These consist of a post-medieval/modern gravel pit (**Figure 6** no. **9**), and the WWII tank training area which covers most of the Site. A total of six Scheduled Monuments are within the research radius (**Figure 6** nos. **1-6**). These comprise prehistoric field monuments, three of which (two segments of the Battery Bank, and a Bronze Age barrow) are immediately adjacent to the boundary of the Site on two sides. Three additional Scheduled barrows are situated to the north and south-west of the Site, and two further non-designated examples (**Figure 6** nos. **7 & 13**) are located close by. In addition, there are six other non-designated assets of various dates within the research area (**Figure 6** nos. **8-12 & 14-15**).

Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs




Figure 7. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (Table 45; Figure 7). There are no recorded designated assets on the Site, but the north part of the Site contains a single post-medieval nondesignated asset (Figure 7 no. 22) relating to gravel extraction. There is a non-designated Bronze Age barrow (Figure 7 no. 17) c. 500m to the south of the Site, and post-medieval extraction pits to the south-west (Figure 7 nos. 18-20). To the northwest of the Site is an area of medieval or post-medieval ridge and furrow (Figure 7 no. 21). There are also a total of 15 Grade II Listed structures in the research area. The Frampton Arms and its stable block are situated c. 300m to the west of the Site. The remaining buildings are all post-medieval residential dwellings associated with the Morton Conservation Area which lies to the north along the opposite side of Station Road (Figure 7 nos. 1-13) from the eastern extent of the Site. A further non-designated asset, a dovecote, is also within the Conservation Area (Figure 7 no. 16).

Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs




Figure 8. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 46**; **Figure 8**). There are three recorded non-designated assets on the Site, comprising post-medieval cultivation/drainage (**Figure 1** no. **6**), post-medieval quarry pits (**Figure 8** no. **11**) and the findspot of a Neolithic axe (**Figure 8** no. **7**). A Scheduled Monument, a Bronze Age bowl barrow (**Figure 8** no. **1**), is situated *c*. 250m to the north of the northern Site boundary. Four Grade II Listed buildings are within the research radius (**Figure 8** nos. **2-5**). These include the 18th century barn and granary buildings at Philliol's Farm (**Figure 8** nos. **4** & **5**) which are situated in the reserved area between the two halves of the Site. Lower Stockley Farmhouse (**Figure 8** no. **2**) dating to the late 18th century is situated *c*. 200m to the west of the Site. The 17th century Warren House (**Figure 8** no. **3**), is located *c*. 400m to the west-south-west. In addition, there are 18 other non-designated assets within the research area (**Figure 8** nos. **8-19** & **12-26**). Many of these relate to post-medieval agriculture, boundaries and trackways, although there are also potentially earlier features, and a number of structures/features which relate to the WWII.

Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs




Figure 9. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 48**; **Figure 9**). There are no recorded designated or non-designated assets on the Site. The Staple Cross, a post-medieval cross base, situated to the south-west of the Site at the junction of the A35 with Hawthorn Road, is a Scheduled Monument (**Figure 9** no. **1**). This is situated at the southern extent of the Burton Conservation Area (**Figure 9** no. **21**) which runs north-south to the west of the Site, within the research area. It contains 15 Grade II Listed buildings (**Figure 9** nos. **3-17**) which comprise post-medieval residential and a few farm buildings. A further Grade II Listed building, Peppercorn Cottage lies immediately to the south of the Conservation Area (**Figure 9** no. **2**). A post-medieval gravel pit and a timber yard site are noted as non-designated assets within the village of Burton (**Figure 9** nos. **19** & **20**). A Bronze Age cremation (**Figure 9** no. **18**), occurred *c*. 500m to the south.

Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs




Figure 10. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (Table 50; Figure 10). There are no designated assets on the Site, but part of it is covered by post-medieval water meadows, a non-designated asset (Figure 10 no. 14). There is also the findspot of prehistoric material (Figure 10 no. 11) on the Site. There are a total of 10 Grade II Listed structures within the research area. Two post-medieval residential buildings are situated c. 450m to the north of the Site (Figure 10 nos. 1-2), a 19th century bridge (Figure 10 no. 3) c. 100m to the east, with two agricultural buildings and a residential building to the east (Figure 10 nos. 4-6). These are closely adjacent to the Site. The remaining buildings are all post-medieval residential dwellings associated with the Morton Conservation Area, which lies to the south (Figure 10 nos. 7-10). A further seven non-designated assets occur around the west and north sides of the Site (Figure 10 nos. 12-13 & 15-19), and include later prehistoric-medieval quarries and tracks, post-medieval water meadows, a mill, and medieval or post-medieval settlement.




Figure 11. Heritage Assets within a 500m buffer zone of the Site

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 52**; **Figure 11**). There are no recorded designated assets on the Site, but 10 non-designated assets, which cover large parts of it, including water meadows, as well as later prehistoric, Romano-British, and medieval agricultural features, trackways and post-medieval extraction pits (**Figure 11** nos. **16-25**). There are further areas of similar non-designated assets on all sides as well as a Bronze Age barrow (**Figure 11** nos. **10-13** & **26**), The Grade II Listed Frome Bridge is situated *c*. 150m to the north of the Site (**Figure 11** no. **1**), and eight Grade II Listed buildings (**Figure 11** nos. **2-9**) in the village of Woodsford to the west.

Heritage assets on the Site and in the environs

A research buffer of 500m was utilised to assess the presence of archaeological sites and heritage assets (**Table 54**; **Figure 12**). There are no recorded designated assets on the Site, but there are four non-designated assets. These consist of parts of post-medieval/modern extraction pits, medieval ridge and furrow, Romano-British occupation (**Figure 12** nos. **31**, **32** & **34**), and at the southern tip of the entrance easement it overlaps with the non-designated asset area of the existing Swanworth Quarry (**Figure 12** no. **17**). There are a number of Scheduled Monuments within the research area. There are a pair of Bronze Age barrows *c*. 200m to the east of the Site (**Figure 12** nos. **1** & **2**), and further examples *c*. 200m to the south (**Figure 12** no. **3**) and 500m to the south (**Figure 12** no. **4**). The Scheduled Monument of Kingston Down Romano-British Farm is just outside the research area to the south-west (**Figure 12** no. **5**). There is a Grade II Listed building Kingston Barn (**Figure 12** no. **6**) *c*. 400m to the north of the Site. The Kingston Conservation Area is also situated just outside the research area to the north-west. In addition, there are 29 non-designated assets within the research area. These occur on all sides of the Site and include a Neolithic findspot, areas of Bronze Age, Iron Age and Romano-British habitation and fields, medieval ridge and furrow and fields, post-medieval quarries, and a WWII radar station.
