Terrain:
Mix of gravel tracks,
grassy tracks
and quiet lanes

On road: **20**% Off road: **80**%

Hills:

4 on main route 2 on short loop

Start:

Church Farm Campsite, Sixpenny Handley. Park in field behind church.

1) Church Farm campsite

Lat 50:57.323'N Long 2:00.434'W

3.5km / 2.2m to next point

Out of campsite, turn R and follow road down to the school. The road bends round to right but take the track straight ahead of you, past the white house (currently a funeral directors, Park Cottage).

About 200m past Brushy Bush house follow the bridleway to the L for just under a kilometre until you get to a bridleway crossroads.

Turn L and cycle down this tarmac road (still a bridleway) until you get to the main road (A354).

2 Bridleway / A354 Junction

Lat 50:55.847'N long 2:01.143'W

bridleway on the right.

3.7km / 2.3m to next point



Take extreme care and cross straight over. Pedal up this grassy track. You pass two bridleways on your right, pedal on for another ½ km and take the next

You should now see a concrete triangulation point to the left. Head down this track for just over 11/2km, going round a L then R bend until you meet a gravel track on your left (not marked as bridleway). Follow this up to the T junction in front of the barn.

(3) Bridleway Junction by barn

Lat 50:54.356'N Long 2:00.387'W

5.3km /3.3m to next point

Turn L. Up hill now for 1½ km. this is Ackling Dyke, a Roman road. Go past 1st bridleway on right until you get into wooded section and come to bridleway crossroads.

You will see a small memorial stone to John Ironmonger on the left. Turn R for 50m until vou see a track on the R just before field. Take it, keeping L (field is on your left, wood on your right) until you reach the gravel track.

Turn R, keep straight on all the way to the road through bridleway junction.

Track end, Gussage All Saints

Lat 50:53.787'N Long 2:00.169'W

2.3km / 1.4m to next point

Turn L at the memorial cross opposite the churchyard and this takes you past the Drovers pub (good place to stop). Carry on to the T junction.

Turn L and cycle up the hill for 1.6km passing a bridleway with a metal gate on your left. before taking the next bridleway on L. just past the red brick house.

NB. If you want to stop in Wimborne St Giles carry along the

road for a further 11/2km. To reioin the route take the 1st road on the left in the village, signposted Monkton Up Wimborne, past The Bull pub and carry straight on until vou see a bridleway track on left going up the hill, signposted to Harley Gap. Cycle up here past All Hallows Farm. When you see the bridleway on your left you are reigining the route (*see below).

5 Road / Bridleway junction

Lat 50:54.202'N Long 1:58.787'W

3km / 1.8m to next point

Follow this bridleway through the wood, ignoring the 1st tracks on your right and left. The bridleway then goes round to the right (there is a private wood ahead of you). Follow round edge of the field through a hedge until vou come to a bridleway T-iunction. Turn L

*NB if you are coming up from Wimborne St Giles it's straight on.

Turn R at next junction and L soon after. This takes you along the top of Hartley Down. Keep pedalling straight until you get to the woods and the bridleway crossroads. You have been here before! The memorial stone to John Ironmonger is straight ahead of you.

6 Memorial stone Junction

Lat 50:55.268'N Long 1:59.841'W

4.3km /2.7m to finish

This time turn R downhill to the road.



At the road turn **L** until you get to the A354. Take extreme care and cross straight over and keep

on this road for just under 2km until you get back to the school in Sixpenny Handley. Turn **R** back up to the car park and campsite.
