Bournemouth, Dorset and Poole Draft Mineral Sites Plan - further comments received

Dear Mr Hill,

Thank you for your comments on the further information provided in support of the Bournemouth, Dorset and Poole Draft Mineral Sites Plan.

The invitation for further comment only applied to a selected group of documents, and not to all proposed modifications or issues arising from the Hearings. - The new national planning policy framework (NPPF) was published on 24 July 2018. The council has prepared a <u>statement</u> setting out its approach to ensuring that the Mineral Sites Plan is compliant with the new NPPF. It is proposing a number of modifications to the Plan in order to ensure that references within the Mineral Sites Plan reflect the new NPPF. These are set out in the updated <u>schedule of modifications</u>, highlighted in blue. You can comment on the modifications proposed in relation to the NPPF. You can also comment on whether the publication of the new NPPF raises any additional issues. Please send any comments by 17:00 on 31 October 2018.
- The council has published five additional evidence documents. These are three heritage assessments relating to Hurst Farm, Station Road and Philliols Farm; a cumulative traffic impact assessment in relation to Trigon, Philliols and Tatchell's; and the most recent local aggregates assessment. You can comment on these documents, which are available below see Background Documents MSDCC73 MSDCC77. Please send any comments by 17:00 on 31 October 2018.

Having reviewed your comments it looks like some relate to these specific documents on which further comment has been invited at this time, while others don't. However, I can confirm that all comments have been forwarded to the Inspector and she will decide how to treat them.

**Please note** that when all the modifications arising from the Hearings have been made and assessed there will be a formal consultation of these modifications (expected to be early in the New Year) and I wanted to stress the importance of re-submitting your comments (and any others you wish to make) at that stage, to ensure they are duly considered by the Inspector.

Please note also that further comments have been invited on a cumulative impacts screening exercise. If you wished to comment on these, comments are to be received by the 14<sup>th</sup> November, as set out below.

 The council has prepared a <u>statement</u> on a matter raised regarding the referencing of assessment of cumulative impacts within the sustainability appraisal of the Plan. A further screening exercise is <u>now</u> <u>available</u>. For clarification, all parties have until the end of Wednesday 14th November 2018 to comment on this screening exercise document.
