



Biodiversity Checklist - Rural Location

- Only for use with application sites which are impacting on an area less than 0.1ha.
- The below is intended as a guide for when and which ecological survey will be required to support your planning application. If professional ecological advice has identified further surveys are required, these should always be undertaken before the application is submitted to the Planning Authority.
- Where the checklist indicates that no surveys are required, a copy of this should be submitted to the planning authority to support your application. The checklist will be reviewed by the validation team and your planning case officer, further evidence such as photographs may be requested to enable this review. Incorrect information provided is likely to cause delays to your planning application.
- If more than one of these features will be impacted and a series of different surveys are indicated by the checklist an Ecological Impact Assessment (EcIA) will be required.
- Where a survey identifies an impact on biodiversity, a standardised Biodiversity Plan is required to be submitted to Dorset Council Natural Environment Team (DC NET) for review.
