Thank you for your letter dated 28<sup>th</sup> October asking for support for the above funding bid in relation to the proposed North Dorchester development. I have briefly discussed this application with Terry Sneller so was aware of your interest in this process.

As such any development of this scale should not only minimise impact on the environment but also create a net gain.
