Activities undertaken by LAP members that have benefitted substantially from LAP support / endorsement	Axminster & Lyme Cancer Support Group: Launched September 2018 with LymeForward support; LymeForward bank account used as holding account, with Chair of Health & Wellbeing Group/Director serving as the group's treasurer and arranging a successful start-up bid to Macmillan for £1,210. Currently 38 clients of whom 19 have attended fortnightly drop-ins and 15 referred to approved therapists. Dorset Home-Start has recruited 10 potential local volunteers currently being trained; this follows an initiative by a member of LymeForward's Health & Wellbeing Group who is becoming a Trustee for Home-Start. Turn Lyme Green (and its subsidiary organisation 'Plastic Free Lyme') has benefited from the services of a LymeForward Director as its Treasurer for three years, who also initiated the meeting of business people that kick-started the Plastic Free campaign.
