I believe that a local Parish Council would help to redress this situation.</p> <p>I would propose, and my Executive Committee would support, the creation of a Parish comprising the current 6 electoral wards that make up Highcliffe and Walkford.</p> <p>Highcliffe and Walkford have strong community identities, and I propose that the area should have a Parish Council, that it should have the style of Highcliffe Community Council, and that the normal electoral arrangements (elections in May 2019 and every 4 years thereafter) should apply.</p>

I would want time to consult with local residents more widely before presenting a view on this idea, and I see that as part of the next consultation phase of this Review. I feel that the widely-felt identity of Highcliffe Village needs to be reflected in any decision taken. If there were a group Parish Council, it could (for instance) be called the Highcliffe, Walkford and Friars Cliff Neighbourhood Council and be subject to the normal electoral arrangements (as above). I am not advocating this at present, but it is under consideration with neighbouring RAs.</p>

This proposal reflects my understanding of the feelings of many residents, as expressed over the years in the public meetings of the HRA. I would expect to conduct more specific public consultations at the next stage of the Review, permitting more authoritative reflection of residents' views at that time.</p> <p>Expanding on Question 1. The Highcliffe ward WHA will include the Roeshot Hill development. This will be a large community, displaced from Highcliffe Village. Highcliffe Residents Association and hence a proposed Council will need to represent the views and needs of this community as it develops.</p> <p>The Ward boundaries are shown as WHA, WHB, NHA, NHB, HCA and HCB on the Christchurch Borough Council Community Governance Review Consultation Parish Map Annex.</p>
