## 54. <u>TOWN CLERK'S REPORT & CORRESPONDENCE</u>

54.1 <u>Boundary changes</u> – The Local Government Boundary Commission has written to the Town Council to inform that the electoral arrangements for the Town has changed as a result of the electoral review of Dorset. These changes is hoped to be implemented at the local elections in 2017 and includes going back to 5 wards for Blandford Forum comprising of 16 councillors, Blandford Badbury Heights represented by one member, Blandford Central, represented by six members, Blandford Hilltop, represented by two members, Blandford Langton St Leonards represented by four members and Blandford Old Town, represented by three members. Councillors requested that the Town Clerk writes to the MP and Boundary Commission highlighting its concern that boundary changes to the town have been made with no consultation.
