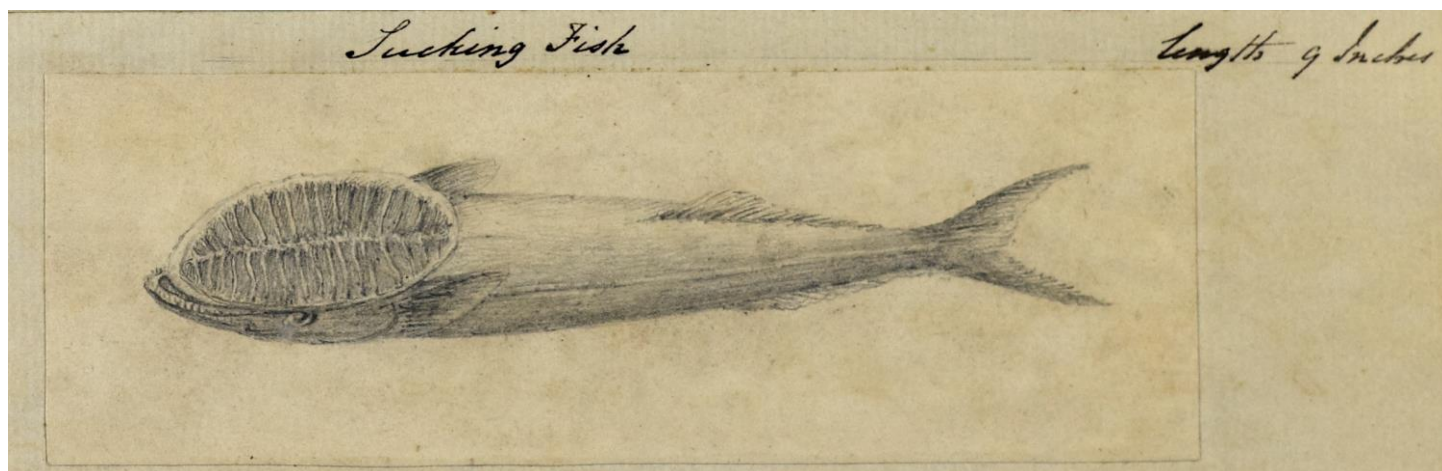


Strange Fish!

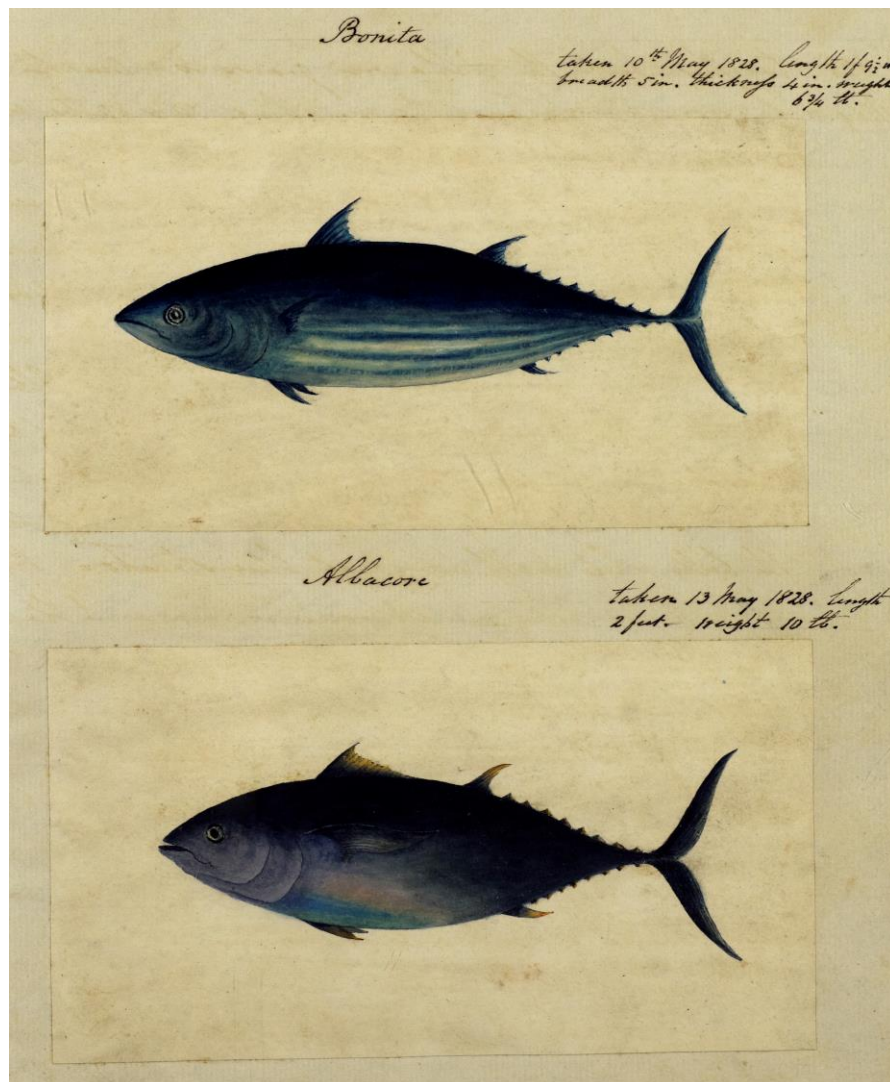
