V3	From the top of Coney Lane where it opens onto field looking east	View across open agricultural land towards Bulbarrow Hill, capturing the beauty of the landscape in the Blackmore Vale
V4	Drum Lane to Droop Footpath	Panoramic views across open countryside towards Bell Hill, Woolland Hill and Bulbarrow Hill, and including the church tower, capturing the beauty of the landscape in the Blackmore Vale

The only other views mentioned in the list but not included are:

- views from Barn End mentioned twice (discounted due to the plateaued nature of the footpath at this point reducing the view's impact),
- view from Village Hall mentioned twice (discounted due to the flat nature of the fields at this point reducing the view's impact),
- view from Emerson Nature reserve mentioned twice (discounted as the main area in the foreground is proposed as local green space and the wider viewshed lies largely beyond the plan area).


