Whilst this area of land is comparatively larger than the other LGS it is a very accessible area of natural greenspace. Access is available direct from the surrounding suburban roads via four entrances along the northwestern boundary (Glennie Road), one from Trenchard Way and a further entrance at the southeastern point of the wood from Putton Lane. A level surfaced path approx 200 metres long loops between the 2 middle entrances off Glennie Way with kissing gates suitable for manual wheelchairs and pushchairs. Other entrances to the site are simple squeeze stiles. There are two short, flat linear routes from the Putton Lane entrance to the pond and from the north eastern entrance off Glennie Way to the high point of the site.
