

Providing LPAs, wills, and wills with trusts

The Diverse Abilities Advice Team can help families with much more than disability benefit applications, appeals, and Carers Allowance, they are also on hand to deal with Lasting Powers of Attorney, wills, and wills with trusts – and these can be for the whole family, not just the person with disabilities or their carers.

A free will writing service is currently available with every LPA application made, and telephone appointments are available throughout the week, we have extended our opening hours until 5.30pm in order to provide more help.

We also have a limited amount of free support for low income families, if you think this might apply to you, please give us a call to find out more.

Scam Awarenesson Friday 30 July, 2pm–3pm. A session delivered by Friends Against Scams on the different types of scams, how to spot them and how to support a victim.

Self-Awareness trainingon Thursday 12 August, 10am–11.30am. This session aims to support carers in adopting a problem-solving approach to allow them to identify the challenges they are facing in their caring role. It includes how to make best use of any resources which may be available. The session will be very interactive, allowing for discussions with other carers.

First Aidon Tuesday 17 August, 11.30am-1pm. A digital workshop where you will learn about every day first aid. The aim is to build confidence so you can help someone in a first aid emergency, using the objects that you have around you. This workshop is specifically aimed at adults.

The Dorset Max Card

The Dorset Max card entitles your child and one other person (such as you or a friend) to free or discounted access or benefits at a range of:

- leisure activities
- activity venues
- shops and cafes
- country parks
- museums and galleries
- organisations

Your Dorset Max Card can be used by your child on their own, or with you or a friend or carer to get free or reduced entry (or other forms of discount) at lots of places.
