DWFRS were consulted on the Bus Gate on 20th June 2024, an email from regulation-tro@dorsetcouncil.gov.uk was sent to control@dwfire.org.uk titled 'Primary Consultation: Traffic Management Scheme (Various Roads, Shaftesbury)'. We did not receive a response and emailed you again on 2nd July 2024, however, we did not receive a response to the second email either. A public consultation was advertised in the Western Gazette between 12th September 2024 – 4th October 2024. Notices were also placed on site at Mampitts Lane and Mampitts Road, Shaftesbury

The vehicular restriction is a requirement of the grant of planning permission and is set out in conditions 33, 34, and 35 of the Decision Noticed issued by the Planning Inspectorate on 12th February 2007. This information has been in the public domain since that time and is declared on new purchasers CON29 searches when properties are purchased. It is the purchaser's responsibility to undertake due diligence before purchasing the property.

The vehicular restrictions are required for highway safety reasons. As set out in the report in the second link at the very bottom of the chain. The first link at the bottom of the chain is the report commissioned by Shaftesbury Town Council, not by Dorset Council.



Afternoon boss,

Yes, it is a permanent closure. Only buses, bikes etc will be allowed in future.

Using Andy Mullins as an example, Google maps agree with the council numbers and say it's currently a 3 min journey and will become a 6 min journey. That was done online this morning whilst very quiet, so is the very minimum increase.

A 6 min response would be a shame, but could be accommodated by the remaining crew. I think it's probably useful to compare to Mark Vidler who lives further South and currently responds by the new proposed route from a bit further away. We know he can routinely take 10mins due to the peak flow traffic on Christys Lane. The existing route does not suffer from peak levels of traffic.

The response for those 3 staff changing from 3 mins to 6-10 mins is a realistic assumption from our current experience.

Morning Dave,

This is a tricky one to deal with, I could approach the town council, but I felt it might be better passed to a higher rank!

There is a proposal underway in Shaftesbury to restrict cars from using a road to the East of the town. We have 3 crew members who respond from that location who will potentially need to find an alternative route when responding. I've enclosed an annotated screenshot of the changes. I've circled where the road will be closed and put 3 crosses on my colleagues home addresses.

The council traffic survey suggests an average 2- 3 min delay on the roads used by our crew once the restriction is implemented. Sadly the peak delay will be considerably more as Christy's lane can be significantly congested. The notes of the committee say that DW have been consulted, but it appears DW have not responded to raise any concern about our crew response.

The changes won't stop us responding, but will have a significant impact on turn out and response times. (2 of our OIC's are affected) I don't know what can be done to achieve a compromise, but it should certainly be raised with the council so that they know what their proposal will produce.

Can you find out what the original DW response was and what is the process to raise our concerns?
