

Healthcare Permit Terms and Conditions

The Permit may be used as follows:

- On a double/single yellow line, for up to 3 hours (but not if there is a ban on loading*) & where it is safe to do so.
- In shared use bays (resident permit holders & pay and display) for up to 3 hours
- In resident permit areas limited to 3 hours.
- In limited waiting areas, for up to 3 hours, unless the waiting period is 4 hours, which will override the Permit.

Where not to park using the Permit:

- *On any yellow lines where there is a ban on loading or unloading (indicated by yellow chevron marks on the kerb, and/or a nearby sign).
- In Off-Street pay and display car parks.
- On private roads.
- Where there are double white lines in the centre of the road, even if one of the lines is broken.
- Outside schools protected by zig-zag lines.
- On a bus stop, bus waiting area or bus turning point.
- On a pedestrian crossing of any type or any white zig-zag lines.
- On a taxi bay, doctor's bay, or disabled bay.
- On a dropped kerb.

The Permit does not override the drivers' responsibility to park with proper care and attention, without causing an obstruction or hazard to other road users or pedestrians.

Permit Terms & Conditions:

- The permit is clearly displayed in the windscreen of the vehicle.
- The permit is set with the correct time of arrival.
- The permit cannot be used with any other parking concession.
- The permit is only to be used for making visits to patients/clients in their homes for medical related purposes or domiciliary care.
- The vehicle registered on the permit must be road worthy with valid vehicle excise duty, MOT and insurance.
- Failure to correctly display a valid Permit may result in the issue of a Penalty Charge Notice.
- Use of the Permit in unauthorised areas may also result in the issue of a Penalty Charge Notice.
- If the permit holder no longer works in the area, the permit should be returned to the Council straight away. A new member of staff should apply for their own permit when appointed.
- If a permit has been altered or tampered with, then a Penalty Charge Notice will be issued to the vehicle displaying the permit.
- The permit does not guarantee the availability of a parking place.
- If your permit is stolen, then a replacement will be issued on production of a crime number from the Police to confirm the theft of the permit or vehicle.
- The loss of a permit must be reported to the Council immediately. A new permit will then need to be applied for.
- The council reserves the right to withdraw any permit found to have been improperly applied for or misused.
- Permits are non-transferable.
