My main objections are:-

1. By installing industrial units near to the Lodmoor pumping station, a very pleasant country walk enjoyed by hundreds of residents and visitors each day will be spoilt. Since the path was tarmacked, it is used throughout the year linking the seafront to the park, shopping facilities, park and ride and provides easy access to the bird reserve. It is also used each Saturday and Sunday by ParkRun, both adults and children numbering well over a 100 participants in each case. It is good to be out in the open air, away from buildings and enjoying the scrubland, bird song and far reaching views. Passing close to industrial buildings with their bins and litter (observed in other light industry situations) will definitely detract from the openness currently experienced.

2. As a resident, I am concerned about the amount of rubbish (or unsightly bins) the industrial buildings would generate. I am also afraid that the noise from electric machines, drilling and sawing could become an irritating nuisance to myself and near neighbours. It would also detract from the pleasure of passers by on their country walk.

3. Traffic and parking is already a problem at the end of Weymouth Bay Avenue with overspill into adjacent roads making it at times very difficult to get out of our drive! The road narrows towards the end of Weymouth Bay Avenue but is regularly used by bird watchers leaving but a narrow path for entrance to the pumping station. The amount of traffic and noise would increase during construction and subsequent deliveries to businesses.

4. As a RSPB volunteer, I am concerned that the birds that roost in the trees (that would have to be felled to accommodate the buildings) would be disturbed. Certainly they would retreat from loud noises! The Lodmoor reserve (a noted SSSI) attracts a wide variety of protected birds and they need as wide an area as possible to continue to flourish.
