

DORSET COUNCIL TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT SCHEME, BRIDPORT ROAD AND WILLIAMS **AVENUE, DORCHESTER**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of Dorset proposes to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended.

The general effect of the order will be to:

- Revoke a section of the no loading between 08:00 10:00 and 16:00 18:00 restrictions along part of Williams Avenue, Dorchester
- Revoke a section of the no waiting at any time restrictions along Bridport Road, Dorchester
- Introduce no loading at any time restrictions along parts of Bridport Road and Williams Avenue, Dorchester

As part of the traffic management scheme, Dorset Council in exercise of powers under Section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 intends to install a new puffin crossing along Bridport Road. Dorchester (on the easterly side of the junction with Williams Avenue, Dorchester) and replace the current signalised crossing on Williams Avenue with a new toucan crossing.
