Williams Avenue junction improvements

What is happening?

Dorset Council is upgrading both ends of Williams Avenue to improve safety and accessibility, creating:

- better, easier crossings and wider footways
- shared footways and cycleways
- changed traffic lanes at the junctions
- modern, more responsive traffic lights
- resurfaced roads

Why now?


- the junctions don't meet modern standards for walking, wheeling and cycling
- the traffic signals need urgent replacement
- government funding is supporting the signal upgrades

Timeline



- **Bridport Road / Williams Avenue** September to December 2025
 - upgraded traffic lights
 - new pedestrian crossing
 - removal of the left-turn lane
 - uphill cycle lane
 - single lane exit from Williams Avenue
 - road resurfacing
- - Damers Road / Williams Avenue January to April 2026
 - upgraded traffic lights
 - new crossing east of junction
 - widened footway/cycleway
 - uphill cycle lane
 - single lane exit from Williams Avenue
 - road resurfacing
