Further to my letter of 19 January 2024, I can confirm that no comments have been received on the submitted statements of case.

The exchange period has now ended. The Inspector will now proceed to write her decision, but may decide to visit the site before doing so.

As previously advised, the purpose of a visit is to enable the Inspector to see the land to which the Order relates, the surrounding area and to note physical features such as stiles, gates, fences, walls, hedges and trees.

There is one formality about unaccompanied site visits that I should explain.
