Policy 2 - Core Spatial Strategy

We are very concerned that the Council's Core Spatial Strategy is unsound due to the fact that it proposes leave Stalbridge and all the district's villages in a prolonged vacuum of uncertainty in an anachronistic mode.

On one hand it is acknowledge that Stalbridge and the district's principle villages are sustainable locations where some development will be permitted whilst on the other hand countryside policies will be used for development management purposes until a review is undertaken either through site allocations in part 2 of the Local Plan or a Neighbourhood Plan. This could be several years ahead but what happens in the meantime? It is simply not good enough. Planning should be all about certainty and there is certainly no certainty in this naïve and unsound plan. Furthermore, we also find Policy 20 the Countryside unsound for similar reasons due to the fact that Stalbridge and the villages will be treated as countryside until allocations in Part 2 or a Neighbourhood Plan.

How do we know how long the villages will take to review and settle a Neighbourhood Plan? How long will Part 2 take to resolve? It is several years of uncertainty. The Plan is therefore, in our opinion, wholly unsound.

We propose that all settlement boundaries in respect of Stalbridge and the villages are retained as existing until review through Part 2 and/or a Neighbourhood Plan.
